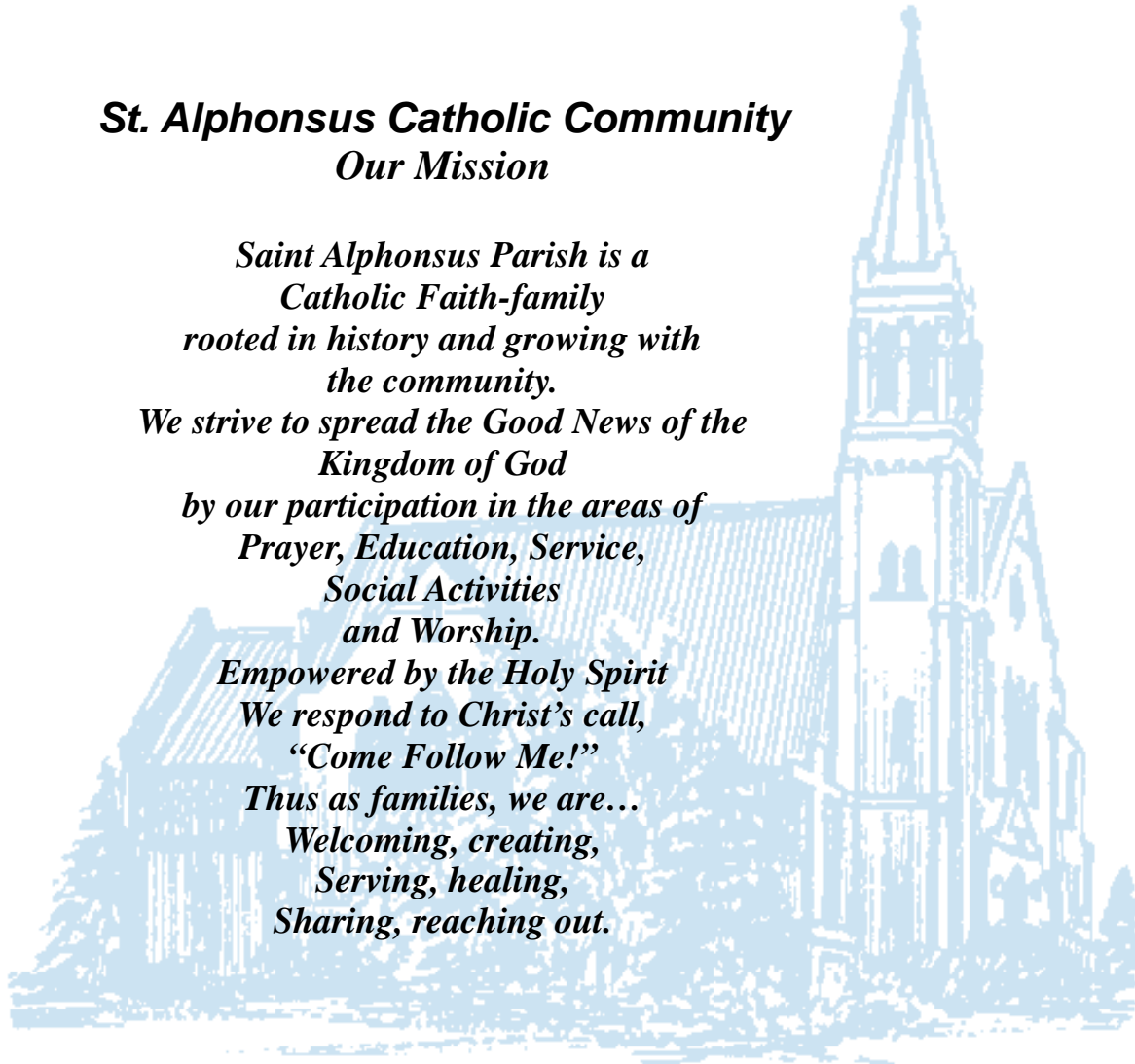

Ash Wednesday, February 25, 2009

Respond: Lord, give us your Holy Spirit. *May we be filled and satisfied, by the word which you give us. (R). Teach us to be loving not only in great and exceptional moments, but above all in the ordinary events of daily life. (R) May we abstain from what we do not really need, and help our brothers and sisters in distress. (R) May we bear the wounds of your Son in our bodies, for through his body he gave us life. (R)*

Thursday, February 26, 2009

Respond: Remember us, Lord, for we are your children. *Teach us to enter more deeply into the mystery of the Church, that it may be more effective for ourselves and for the world as the sacrament of salvation. (R) Lover of mankind, inspire us to work for human progress, seeking to spread your kingdom in all we do. (R) May our hearts thirst for Christ, the fountain of living water. (R) Forgive us our sins, and direct our steps into the ways of justice and sincerity. (R)*

Friday, February 27th

Respond: Lord, have mercy on us. *You went up to Jerusalem to suffer and so enter into your glory, bring your Church to the Passover feast of heaven. From Father Brian's Desk

This **Wednesday, February 25th**, we will begin a new Lenten season with the celebration of **Ash Wednesday**. Even though some children may simply think it is a day in which we walk around with “dirt” on our foreheads, we, as Catholics, know that it means much more. Ash Wednesday signals the beginning of Lent, which is the six-week period before Easter.

The symbolism of Lent begins on **Tuesday, February 24th**, when we will continue the tradition of burning the palms we received last year on Palm Sunday. This ceremony will take place after the 7:30 a.m. Mass on the front porch of the church. Afterwards, everyone is invited to gather in the Parish Hall to enjoy some coffee and breakfast treats as a symbol of “the *feast* before the *Lenten fast*.”

During the Ash Wednesday Mass or prayer service, the members of the congregation are invited to come forward to receive ashes. The priest or minister will dip their thumb into the container full of ashes, anoint a person's forehead with those ashes and while doing so, share with them the Biblical reminder, “Remember that you are dust, and unto dust you shall return.”

The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday are a symbol of our humanity and also the promise of life everlasting. During the day, activities slowly brush away the ashes, but sometimes a small residue is left as a reminder of the ceremony.

Let us try to use these next few days before Ash Wednesday to focus on what we want to do during this Lenten season. Whether it may be through prayer, fasting or almsgiving, we can use these next six weeks to prepare ourselves for the Easter Resurrection and realize how we are all brothers and sisters in Christ.

What Dad's Got To Do With It?

The delivery of octuplets to a single mom has created a debate on many levels. One that struck me was the woman's apparent lack of concern that her 14 children would be raised without a dad. While it's true that there are many single mom's who do an admirable job of raising their children without much assistance from a father, the facts are that children will fair better with a dad in their life. Studies have repeatedly shown that sexual promiscuity is much less likely among boys and girls who have a close relationship with their fathers. Children from a two-parent family are also much

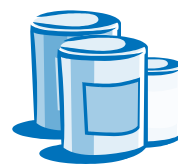
more likely to delay sex until marriage than their peers from single-parent families. Interviews with 7,000 women working in topless bars and strip clubs reveal that the majority did not receive appropriate male attention during their childhoods.

In the Father Connection, author Josh McGowell writes, "These studies suggest that a healthy relationship with Dad is a critical factor in whether young men and women engage in premarital sexual activity." McDowell asserts that fathers who show a respectful, healthy attitude toward sexuality allow their children a glimpse of God.

It's almost mid-February and with Catholic Schools Week behind us, February doldrums often hit. People seem crabbier, sadder, more nervous, etc. Maybe it has something to do with less sun. Possibly we all get tired of being inside.

That's why it was so good to get outside in the warmth of last week. It's important to note that the doldrums hit children, too, especially about studying and homework. This time of year is really the best time for learning, but students don't always take advantage. Here are some suggestions to help them.

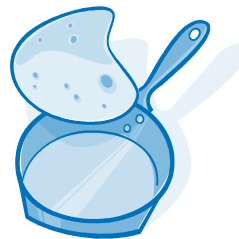
- Enforce study time. If you set aside the required time for study, there's no decision as to whether the child has or does not have homework. They need to spend that time each day in study.
- Check the assignment book. Each child has one and should be using it. You need to check backwards, too, for long term assignments.
- Follow the 15 minutes rule. After 15 minutes check to see that work has been done since the last 15 minutes—especially if they are on the computer. So often they tell us they are doing homework, and they are out in cyberspace doing something else.
- Soft music aids study. Loud music inhibits it.
- Please don't do your child's homework with them. We know that it's sometimes easier, but struggle is often necessary for learning.
- Be positive. Encourage good grades. Offer to help them improve their not-so-good grades. Positive always breeds positive.
- Remind them that homework is not always written. It is important to review the classroom material daily.
- Rewards for good work should be a hug, a discussion of a job well done, a compliment. Those pay-offs are far more long lasting than monetary awards.

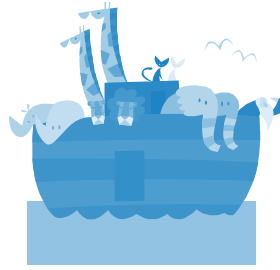
