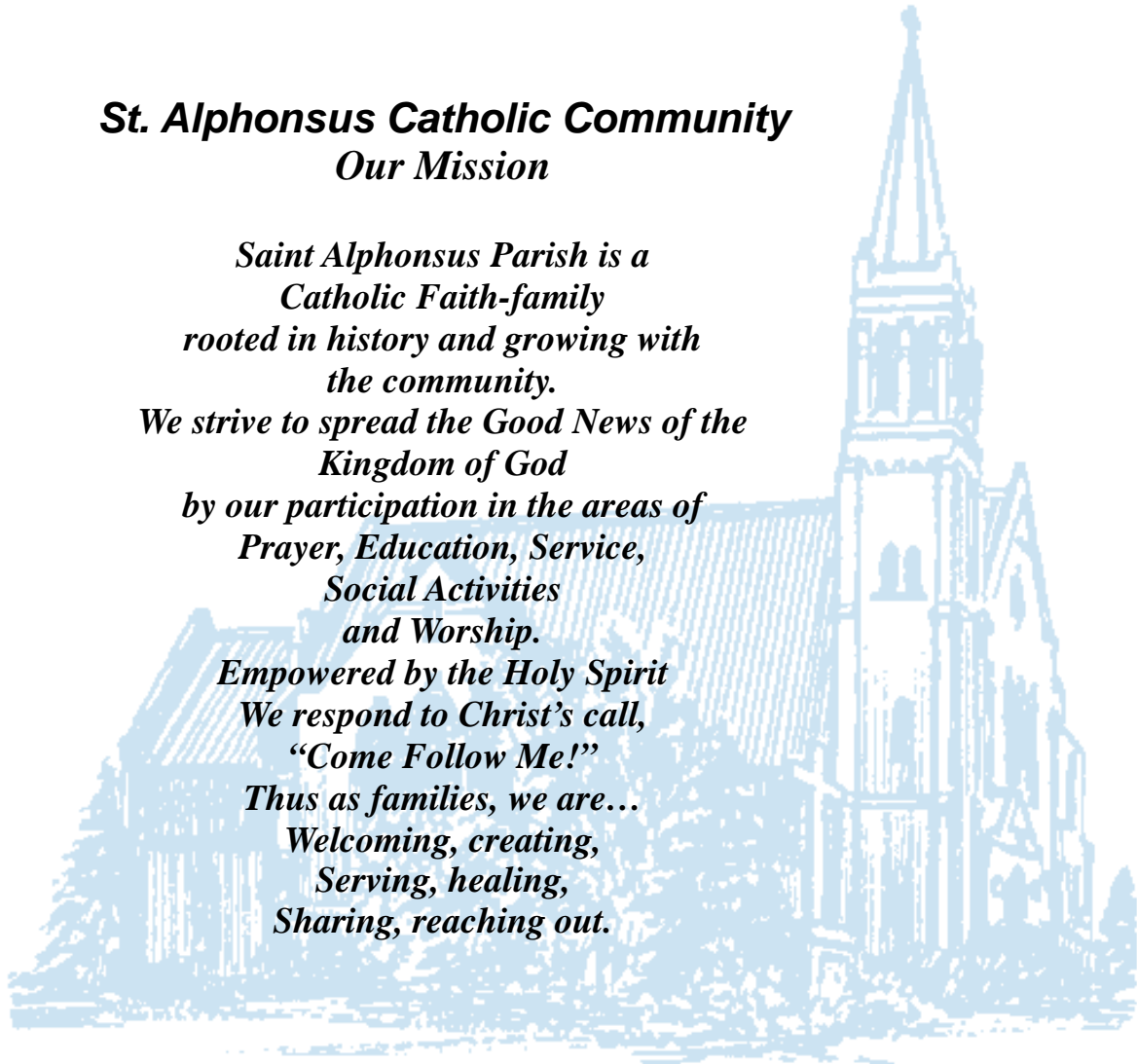

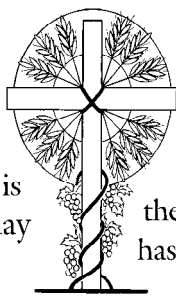

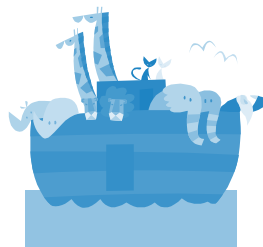

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Paschal Mystery is the key to our Christian faith: the dying and rising of Jesus that is the pattern of our life. In their first steps on the road of faith, the catechumens feel the cross of glory traced over their eyes, on their lips, across their shoulders, on their ears, over their heart, and on their feet. The mystery is that even death gives way to life for those who are held in the embrace of Jesus. Today, many new Christians arise from the waters of the font. Yet the font is not the destination of their journey. The goal is Pentecost, fifty days from now, and a lifetime of praise to the Father, in Christ, in the embrace of the Holy Spirit, for the sake of the world. "Neophyte," our ancient word for newly-baptized people, means "newly-planted" in Greek. If someone in your parish has just been baptized, welcome them today. The smiles on their faces and the light in the eyes is a foretaste of heaven.

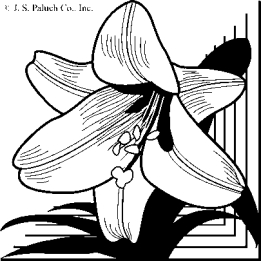


Please Turn In Your Heifer Banks!

From Father Brian's Desk



My Brothers and Sisters,

As we all can agree, we have just experienced a long winter season. The days were cold and dreary and the nights were long. Even though we turned the clocks ahead a few weeks ago to usher in "Daylight Savings Time", the mornings can still be pretty dark.

When Spring arrives, we have a new sense of energy and life. The daylight lasts for a few more hours, the snow and ice turn to water and we can tell that warm weather is just around the corner.

In regards to our Catholic Church calendar, the Lenten Season can seem very similar to winter – cold and dark. WHY IS EASTER SO IM- PORTANT TO CHRIS- TIAN?

This is a question kids ask. Following is an answer given on our website faithfirst.com:

Saint Paul says that if Christ has not been raised from the dead, our faith is in vain and we are among the most pitiful of people. The reason why Paul makes this point is that he understood that our belief in the resurrection of Jesus from the dead is the absolute foundation of our faith in him as God's Son, the second Person of the Blessed Trinity. If Jesus had lived and died exactly as has been reported in the Gospels, but never returned to life, then surely there would be no world-wide movement of his followers after two thousand years. He would perhaps still be remembered as a great religious leader, a man to be admired, but ultimately a human being like the rest of us who was taken away by death. Instead, he is proclaimed as the Messiah, the Christ, who has conquered death itself because of his own divine nature. Eyewitnesses in the first

generation of Christians bore testimony to the fact that the one who died truly rose from the dead. And they were so convinced of the truth of their testimony that they, too, were willing to die for the sake of Jesus' name. For two thousand years, Christians have continued to offer witness to their conviction that Jesus still lives, that he is alive in the Spirit, and that his presence in our midst is much, much more than a happy memory. The importance of Easter lies in the fact that on that day above all we Christians celebrate the central mystery of faith, our belief in the resurrection of Jesus from the dead.
