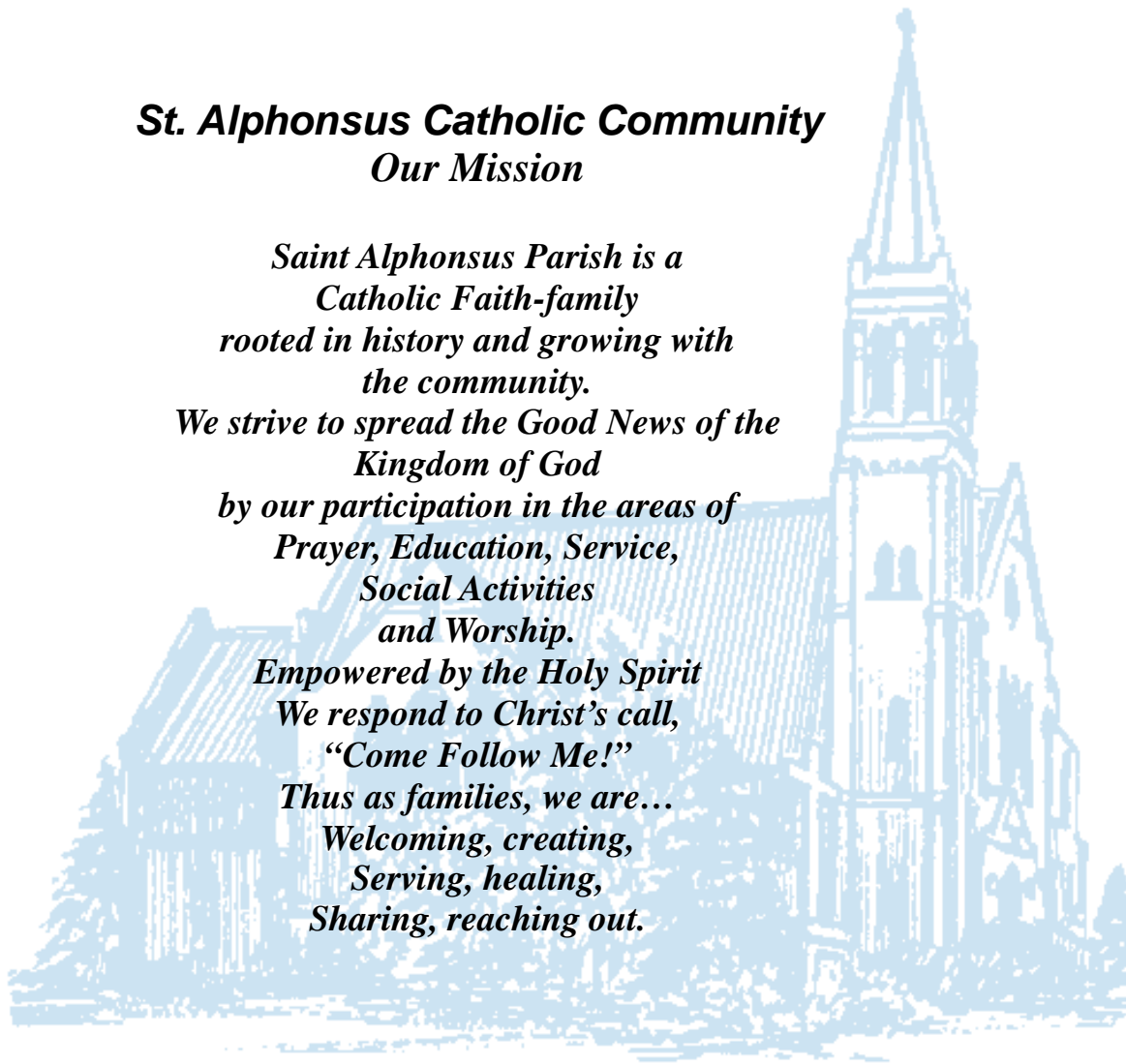

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Looking Ahead To Listen Today

In next week's first reading the prophet Jeremiah will say, on behalf of God, "Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock of my pasture" (Jeremiah 23:1). Today Amaziah, a priest of King Jeroboam, represents the archetype of this kind of shepherd. Against this sort of uncaring shepherd, God calls a real life-vocation shepherd and a true shepherd-prophet, Amos. The voice of Amos is one of the harshest in the prophetic literature, but the harshness seems to be necessary to counteract the misleading and scattering of the flock that the God of Israel was observing. Amos left his vocation as a shepherd of sheep and dresser of sycamore trees to become a shepherd of the flock of Israel and a re-dresser of the wrongs committed by those whose status as priest or prophet of Israel had led them astray from their own vocation. Another prophet, Jeremiah, would tell of the coming shepherd-king, anointed from the house of David, who will come to restore justice and righteousness throughout the land.

Looking Back To Look Ahead

It is important to connect this week's Gospel with last week's. Jesus had just encountered a severe lack of faith in his family and neighbors, who took offense at him. So severe was their reaction to him that he couldn't work much in the way of healing or other mighty deeds. Yet immediately upon the heels of that incident, he summons the Twelve and sends them out ("apostle" means "one who is sent"). Jesus remains stalwart in the pursuit of the vocation he was given by God: to recover the lost sheep of the house of Israel. We have to admire the Twelve, who like Amos have left their own livelihoods as they are sent out on a rather intimidating new mission. Our admiration ought to increase when we realize that this takes place immediately after the rather humiliating scene Jesus had just endured. But having witnessed Jesus face rejection and still persevere in his vocation, they must have been made bold as he told them of the rejection they would face when he sent them out. Christ, through the Spirit and the waters of baptism, still sends us out on mission. This is our first calling. Let us, strengthened by the prophetic witness of Christ and the Twelve, be faithful to that calling.

These faithful people responded to the call, prophesying and preaching to the people to whom they had been sent. Each of us received a call when we were baptized. The second reading invites us to ponder that call as we are reminded that we are chosen in Christ and that, in love, God "destined us for adoption" (Ephesians 1:5). As adopted daughters and sons of God we are called to bring the presence of Christ into our marriages, families, schools, and places of work. Let us be inspired today to say "yes" to the call we hear once again through God's living word.

“Because I Told You To!”



How often have you heard those words coming from your mouth when your child has questioned your authority? If you haven't yet...just wait! You can look forward to this occurrence as yet another “teachable moment” with your child.

Our society holds up

“freedom” as one of its most precious values. As they grow older, our children are learning to make choices on their own. Unfortunately, our children can be tempted to interpret freedom of choice as a right to do whatever they want. How does our faith inform parents on how to respond to these teachable moments? Our challenge is to provide our children with a proper perspective of what freedom entails. Through Scripture stories, like that of King David in the Old Testament, God reminds us that choice is not just a *gift* granted to human beings; it is a *responsibility* as well. How you use this gift will affect your life and your relationships. And, ultimately, your relationships (with God & others) determines your happiness.

In your conversation about freedom, lead the conversation to the relationship between freedom and the necessity on everyone's part to act in a responsible way because, though we are free to act as we want, our actions naturally have consequences we must live with. Make the point that a child acts in a responsible way when they respect the authority of God and the ones God gave him as a parents..... You can refer to the 4th Commandment!

For a child with a faith perspective, your authority becomes divine authority, and the “I” becomes “We told you so!”

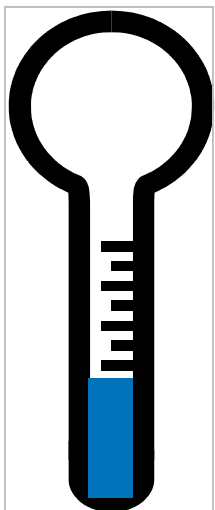

SPRED sessions offer both catechists and friends a wonderful opportunity for peaceful reflection on both our personal life experiences and on the Word of God....In contrast to the buzz and flurry of our daily lives, SPRED offers havens of peace and a chance to be directed by the still, small voice of God.

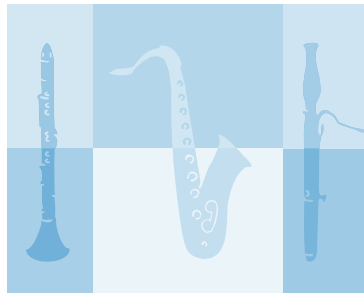
