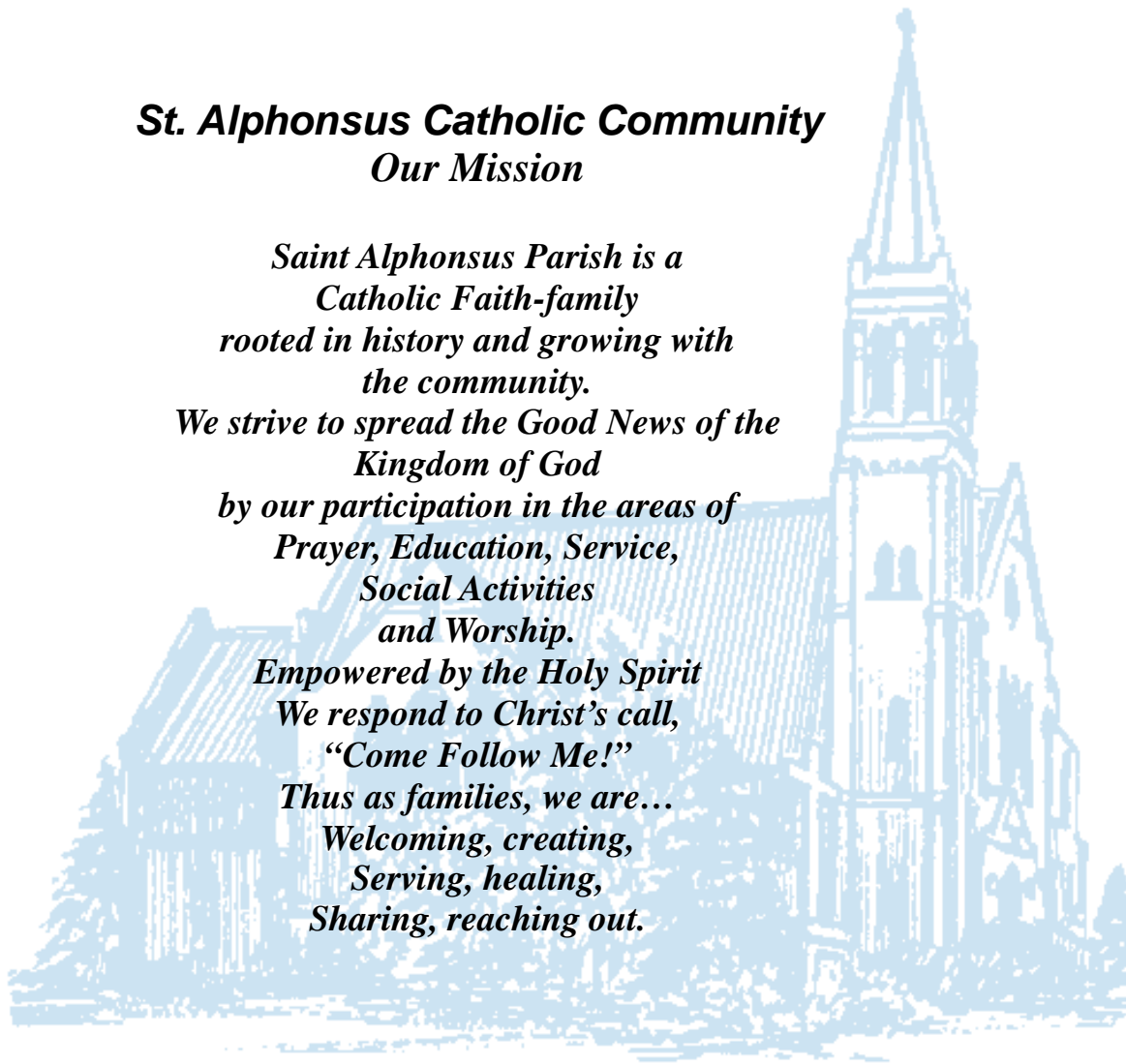

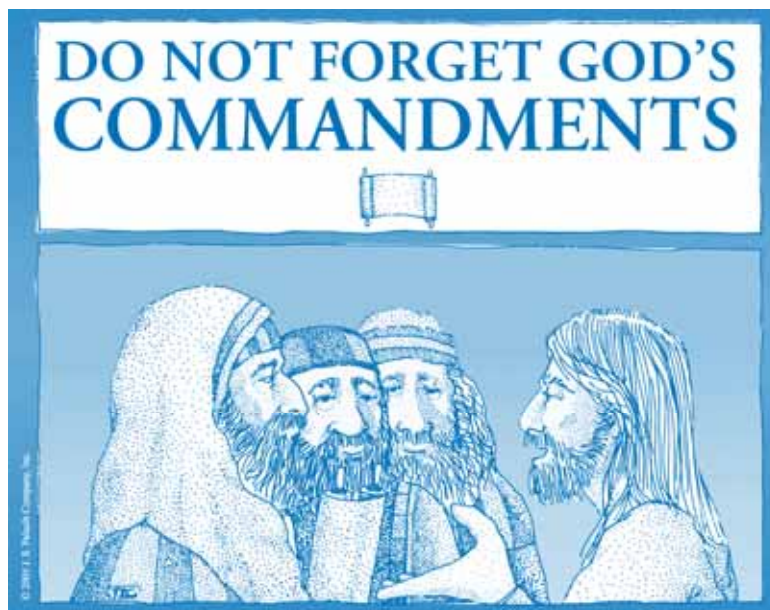

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time Lip Service

Of all the human frailties and foibles, faults and sins, the one that seems to elicit the worst howls is hypocrisy. When we profess to believe and practice one thing, and then are caught behaving in the opposite way, our shame is (or ought to be) profound. Religious hypocrisy is probably the worst. When we hold our actions and beliefs to a higher standard and then fail to live up to them, it's human and sinful and flawed. But when we proclaim that we are holding up that higher standard at the same time that we are knowingly violating it, there is a fundamental dishonesty, a breach of truth that is especially repugnant. It adds sin to sin and dishonors the very idea of virtue. It becomes a scandal.

Sincerity And Truth

Jesus was constantly trying to get people to see and understand that mere observance of the law was not what pleased God. What is in the heart is what is most important. This does not mean that good intentions justify bad actions! We humans are complicated and wily. We are quite capable of creating huge and complex human structures that are just difficult enough to convince us that we are following some right "way" and that others are not. God's laws are simple: love God, love your neighbor as yourself. There is no need to complicate love.

Jesus points out that real uncleanness comes from within a person. Evil intentions and every kind of bad behavior have their roots in our inner sinfulness, our selfishness. That is what Jesus came to save us from. Of course we cannot, by our own devices, be better people. We are utterly dependent on God for the necessary change of heart that will result in good and loving actions. God freely offers us this help, if only we would stop hiding behind the screen of self-righteousness. If we are humble enough to recognize our own selfishness, and loving enough truly to care for the well-being of others, we will be able to fulfill both the letter and the spirit of the law.

The Highest Law

From time to time, newspapers and magazines will offer, as an item of "filler," various laws that are still on the books but seem silly to us in our day and age. In one California city, it is illegal to have two indoor bathtubs in one house. Clean water, a precious commodity when the law was written, is now readily available, so the law seems silly. But the human value of protecting and preserving precious resources is still around, evident in many conservation laws that seem sensible to us. So it is with the laws of religious tradition. What Jesus scorns today is others' attitude toward ritual laws, an attitude that becomes nearly idolatrous when laws are observed for their own sake. What Jesus teaches today is that observation of external ritual laws is of value only when they are emblems of our internal disposition toward the will of God. Our whole lives must follow the one ultimate law of God: to love God completely and to love neighbor entirely. Roman Catholicism is a tradition rich with customs, traditions, and even laws. As we continue to listen to the voice of Christ, we must always look into our own hearts and underneath our ritual practices to make sure that love of God and love of neighbor are what we prize above all.

Reflections On NCEA Convention

This is the 3rd in a series of re-



lections on my participation in the *National Association of Catholic Educators* annual convention.

One of the highlights of the convention for me was the story told by one of the keynote speakers, Immaculee Ilibagiza. She shared her personal story of miraculous survival and conversion during the Rwanda genocide in 1994 when she and seven other women huddled silently together in the cramped bathroom of a local pastor's house for 91 days! She touched the hearts of all us in attendance as she related her experiences; Experiences that showed us how to embrace the power of prayer, develop a lasting relationship with God, and discover the importance of forgiveness and the meaning of truly unconditional love and understanding... even through our darkest hours.

We had the opportunity to process and reflect on Immaculee's story by attending a presentation on conversion and choosing one of 5 modes of reflection. I chose a new experience for me: walking a labyrinth. I appreciated being able to take the time to quietly raise my awareness of my inner spiritual journey and connecting it to my outer journey.

Are You Registered?

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community. It makes a commitment in all its dimensions brings many advantages, recognition and responsibility.

Being a registered parishioner makes the process much easier when it is time for infant baptism, school registration, weddings, or when asked to be a baptismal or confirmation sponsor. You are also able to deduct your yearly contributions to the parish on your income tax.

A registered parishioner also receives all parish mailings. Church law advises that territories or boundaries no longer limit parish registration. We accept anyone who wants to share in the life of our parish regardless of where they live. Why not sign up? You are surely welcome

Fed By The Lord

People who suffer from Celiac disease and cannot tolerate any wheat or gluten intake may be able to tolerate low-gluten hosts. We have obtained a certain amount them (0.01% total gluten content) and we will provide them at every liturgy.

We ask that if you would like to receive the low-gluten host, then please wait until the **end** of Communion and approach the Eucharist Minister near the Tabernacle, who will provide you with the gluten-free host.

We welcome all those who have these health issues to be part of Communion Celebrations. We are all members of the Body of Christ.

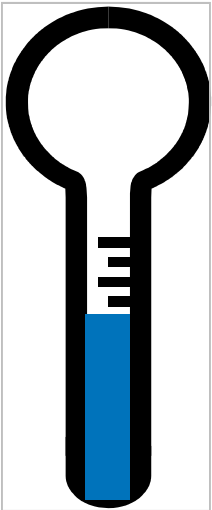

The floor plan of *By Your Side* is set up to promote and create a natural environment, the first of it's kind in the Chicago area.

The center is made up of rooms found in a home with subtle accommodations (e.g. safety corners, visual/picture cues) to support the child with autism. The facility also includes instruction rooms which are specifically created for one on one teaching of skills in a room free of all stimuli. Language concepts, communication strategies and social skills are then taught within the activities of each of the "home" rooms.
