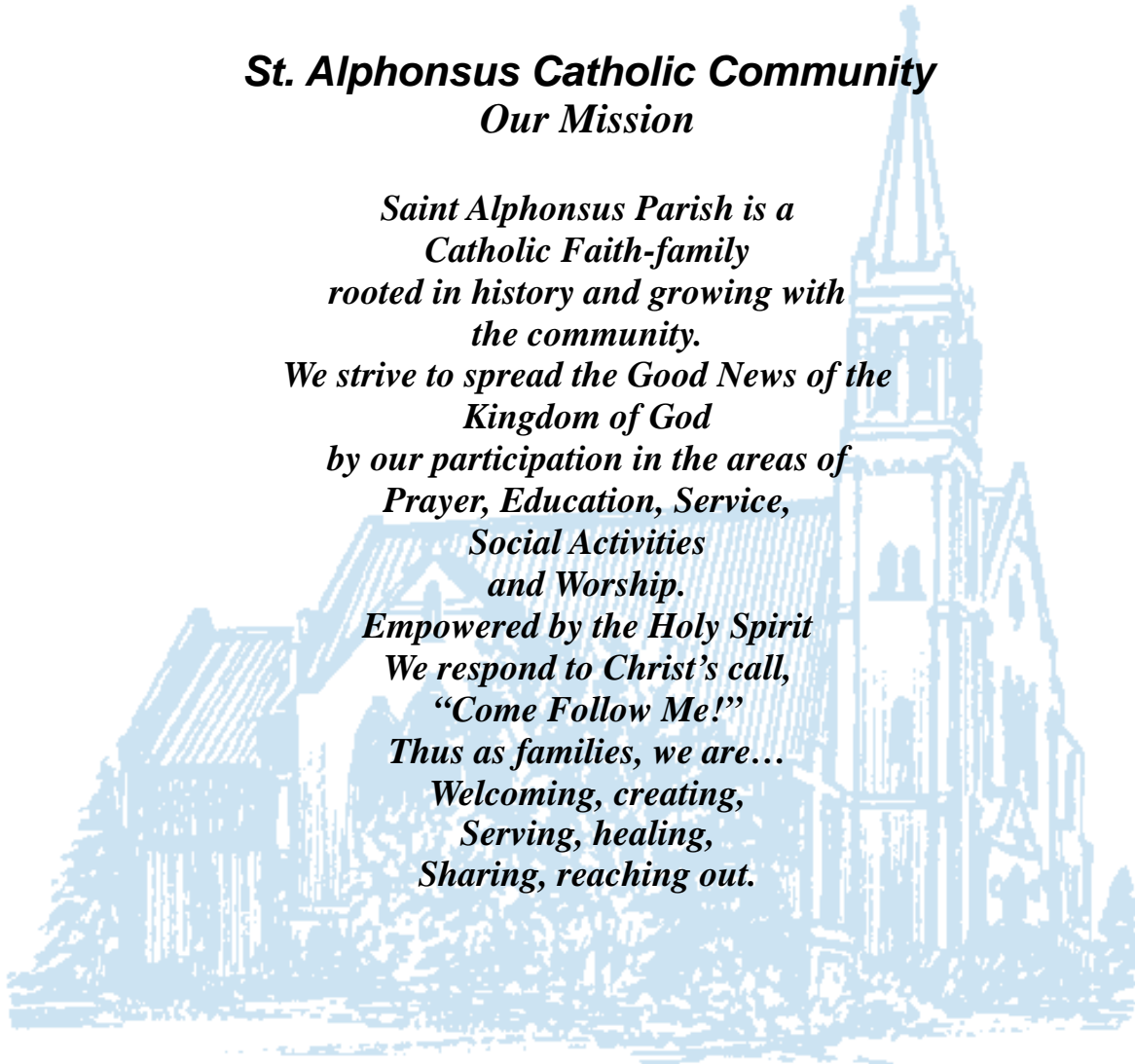

## Taken from Sight

In biblical texts, a time period lasting forty days, months, or years is always a period of testing, trial, probation, or discipline, ending in restoration, revival, or renewal. There are at least ten instances in the Old Testament and New Testament in which the number forty occurs. For example, Noah sailed in his ark after it rained for

forty days and nights; Moses was on the mountain forty days and nights; the Israelites wandered for forty years in the desert after the Exodus from Egypt; Jesus fasted in the wilderness for forty days and was seen on the earth for forty days after his resurrection until his ascension into heaven. The Ascension marks the completion of Jesus' earthly ministry. Along with the Resurrection, the Ascension underlines Jesus' claim that he is truly God and truly human, the Messiah — the one who saves. Early Christian artists showed the importance of the Ascension as the final overthrow of Satan's power. Jesus is depicted as a lion conquering the dragon, Satan. Evil and death are not the end. Nowadays, Christians are being challenged by newly fashionable atheist writers, who assume that all believers are literal fundamentalists who think that heaven is just "up there" above the clouds. The Church, more wisely, does not dwell on where heaven is, but what it means to have a Savior who has gone to prepare a place for us and who will return at the end of time. Whenever we participate in the Eucharistic liturgy we are invited to repeat the mystery of our faith: "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again." So Jesus is taken from our earthly sight because he has returned to God, where he intercedes for us and assures us of the continual outpouring of the Holy Spirit — our strength for the journey.

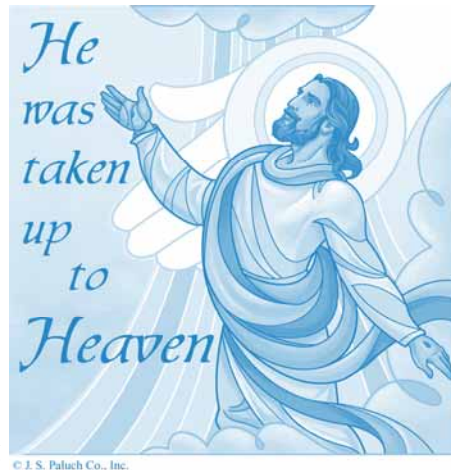

## Farewell Blessing

In the Hebrew scriptures the “farewell blessing” is a fairly common way to end the story of the lives of the great figures in Israel’s faith. The farewell blessings of Jacob, Moses, and David are particularly notable. At the end of Luke’s Gospel, we have a “farewell blessing” by Jesus; it is the only time that Jesus is described as giving a blessing to his disciples. Jesus’ farewell, of course, is different. Unlike Jacob, Moses, and David, who gave this blessing at the time of their deaths, Jesus bestows his blessing as he prepares to enter into new and glorious life seated at the right hand of God in heaven. His blessing, like that of his predecessors, is meant to give them strength and courage. But it also has another purpose: it prepares them to be sent out on a mission. In this way, it is a precursor to the dismissal blessing we receive at the end of every Mass. Yes, the grace of God’s blessing strengthens us, but it is also a dynamic force that sends us out on a mission to continue the life and the work of the Risen Christ.

## St. Rita of Cascia (1391-1457) ~ May 22

If you’re ever in Philadelphia on May 22, forget parking anywhere near St. Rita’s shrine. Cars line streets and fill medians as throngs pack a candlelight vigil and six Masses, honoring this patroness of lost causes, hopeless situations, and — as her statue in countless churches built by twentieth-century immigrants testifies — difficult marriages, troubled homes, and alienated children. Wise people warn, be careful what you pray for. “Divine Savior,” Rita prayed, “let me suffer like you!” Obedient to parents who refused her wish to become a nun, Rita married a man who returned her devotion with twenty years of abuse. When enemies murdered him, Rita’s two sons swore revenge. Paintings depict her pointing the angry boys toward Christ crucified, whom she begged to restrain them. Within the year, both sons died. Alone now, Rita went to the convent but was refused. The nuns feared violence, since one of them was related to the murderer. Rita arranged peace between the families, made vows, and became much sought after as a counselor and intercessor for forty years on earth — and ever since in heaven.

I was honored to be elected and installed as president of the National Association of Parish Catechetical Directors at the annual convention last month. NPCD advances the professional development of parish catechetical directors through workshops and programs. It is a strong voice on religious education issues at the local, regional and national levels, and creates networks of NPCD members that serve, support and encourage parish directors of religious education.

My role as Midwest Representative on the NPCD Executive Committee over the last 5 years has contributed to my ministry here at St. Alphonsus. NPCD has affirmed our efforts and held up Saint Alphonsus parish as a model program when we were presented with a national award. As an NPCD representative, I was invited on the CARE (Chicago Association of Religious Educators) board and the Archdiocese Catechetical Advisory board - allowing me to raise our faith community's concerns, and bring ideas back to our faith community. I became aware of the INSPIRE initiative that has benefited all 3 parishes. I also became aware of tools like the ACRE Surveys developed by NPCD that we use to evaluate our program. And I'm able to put more ideas and useful resources into the hands of catechists as a result of my involvement.

I feel privileged and fortunate to be in catechetical ministry. I'm hoping that I can contribute to it on the national level as president of this inspiring association of leaders (and followers). I appreciate your prayers.

As we continue to celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord during this Easter season, I invite you to join me in supporting the Archdiocesan Office of Assistance Ministry, victims-survivors, priests and others in the creation of a Healing Garden.

The idea of the Healing Garden was initially brought to me in 2008 by a victim-survivor of clerical sexual abuse and staff members from the Office of Assistance Ministry. They and others who were supportive of this initiative proposed the construction of a beautiful place of refuge, prayer, reflection and solitude, where God, whose goodness is visible in creation, might help all victims-survivors of sexual abuse in their journeys toward healing and reconciliation.

Through collaborative efforts with the Jesuit Community, this Healing Garden will be located at Holy Family Parish on Roosevelt Road in Chicago, which is centrally located and easily accessible by all forms of transportation. The design for the garden will be completed soon, and construction is scheduled to begin this summer. Survivors of sexual abuse in this Archdiocese are actively involved in this Archdiocesan—supported project.

As the Healing Garden takes shape over the next several months, I ask you to join me in praying for all those who seek healing from the wounds of sexual abuse. May the Lord, whose power to make the injured whole and to bring goodness out of evil draw people to follow Him, bless you and those you love with His peace.

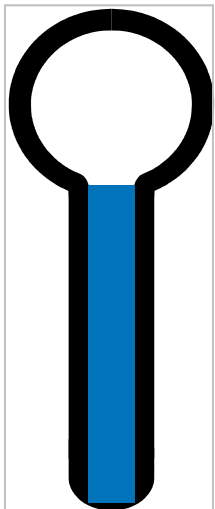
## Are You Registered?

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and to make a commitment in all its dimensions. It also brings many advantages, recognition and responsibility.

Being a registered parishioner makes the process much easier when it is time for infant baptism, school registration, weddings, when asked to be baptismal or confirmation sponsor.

Registering here is very simple. You can go to our web page, [www.st-als.org](http://www.st-als.org), look under "Parish Registration," and fill out the needed information. You can come into the office and fill out a registration form. If your time is limited, you can take the form home and return it via the collection basket on Sundays or mail it to the office.

A registered parishioner receives all parish mailings. Church law advises that territories or boundaries no longer limit parish registration. We accept anyone who wants to share in the life of our parish regardless of where they live. Remember that you need to be a registered parishioner to partake in all the services that St. Alphonsus offers. Why not sign up? You are surely welcome!
