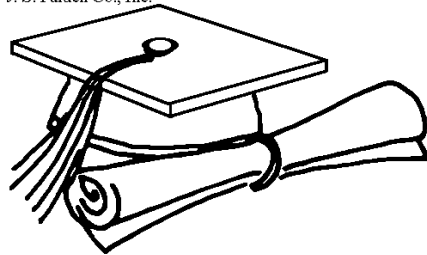

Mystery

There is a well-known story of a teacher who was talking with his students about mystery. “Think of a rose,” he said. Everyone in the room could imagine a rose. “Can you think of the fragrance of a rose?” All heads nodded. “Can you describe that fragrance to me?” No one could. That’s

what mystery is. Something that we know to be true, but is beyond our powers to describe fully. In centuries past, most people lived with mystery more easily, but our modern minds want “just the facts,” and we feel uneasy about anything we cannot easily understand. Today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Trinity — one God in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. In the two thousand-year history of the Church many saints, teachers, and theologians have described the Trinity in long and eloquent prose, but not one can ever arrive at a final definition because the nature of the Trinity is too great to be pinned down in human words. The scriptures show us hints in the *actions* of the one God as Father, Son, and Spirit, and contain many references to the *relationship* among the three as one. And we learn from Jesus’ words to his disciples, recorded in the Gospels, that there is one savior and one salvation, given to us in Jesus Christ himself, which is open to us through the Holy Spirit. Saint Paul calls us the Body of Christ and says that we, as believers, are in relationship with God — equally called, equally chosen, equally loved. Yet within that equality, God has given each of us different gifts, different abilities, and different callings in life. The only thing that God asks is our love in return, and that we use what God has given us. It’s that simple.

Saint Charles Lwanga and his Companions (martyred 1886-87) June 3

"Master of Pages," reputedly the handsomest man in all Uganda, Charles Lwanga, lay catechist, courageously led about forty teenaged boys, Catholics and Anglicans, on a forty-mile forced march to martyrdom for their common Christian faith. Teaching each other the hymns of their different churches, they strengthened one another for the ordeal ahead. King Mwanga, himself barely twenty, had ordered them executed for being "those who pray." But these royal pages were the king's male harem, who, now Christians, refused what pious accounts demurely describe as his "unreasonable demands." Some were clubbed to death, most burned alive; The youngest martyr, was thirteen-year old Saint Kizito, whom Charles had often shielded from the King's lust; and the most tragic was, Saint Mbagu, whose father was his executioner! In 1964, Paul VI canonized the young Catholics and praised their Anglican companions, recalling the heroism of early Christianity's African martyrs, which we modern Christians of far less faith never expected to see repeated. Forty years after the pope's words, what does our faith cost us? Heroism aside, how generous is our response?

2010 National Caribbean American HIV/AIDS Awareness Day

On June 8th and June 27th, and throughout the year, PLEASE PRAY FOR THOSE INFECTED WITH AND AFFECTED BY HIV/AIDS.

June 8th is Caribbean American HIV/AIDS Awareness Day. This disease has devastated the Caribbean, and this area ranks 2nd only to sub-Saharan Africa for the existing number of persons living with AIDS. In 2006 the United Nations estimated that 19,000 Caribbeans died of AIDS and some 250,000 were living with the virus.

June 27th is National HIV Testing Day. It is estimated that 1 out of 5 people living with HIV in the U.S. DO NOT KNOW that they are infected with the virus. If you DO NOT KNOW that you are infected with HIV, you could BE SPREADING IT TO OTHERS. The only way to know if you have HIV is to be tested. This day of national testing is an opportunity for people nationwide to learn their HIV status.

The disease has NO CURE; there is NO VACCINE for it; and it WILL NOT GO AWAY! However, HIV/AIDS CAN BE PREVENTED.

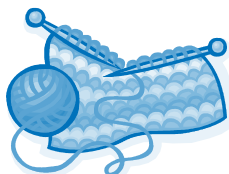

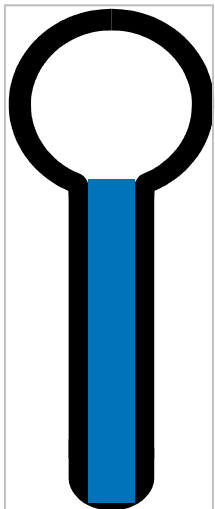
