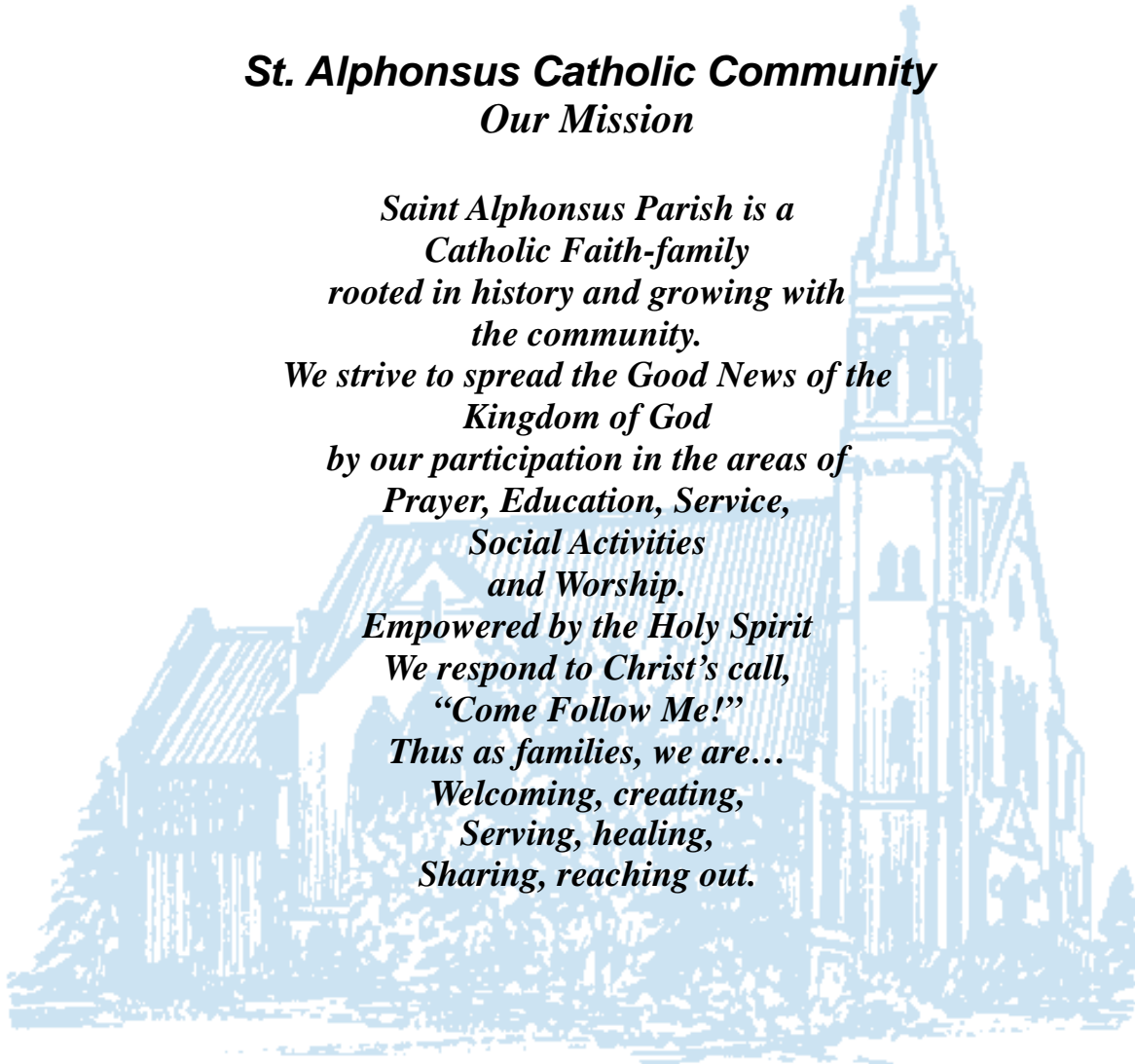

Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein ~ 1891-1942) ~ August 9

Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein)

“Come,” Edith gently whispered, taking her sister Rosa’s hand, “let us go for our people!” these were Edith Stein’s last words as the Nazis, enraged at the Dutch bishops’ condemnation of their genocide, took into custody all Catholic converts from Judaism. Born Jewish, but non-practicing from her teens, Edith’s search for truth led to a doctorate in philosophy, a brilliant career as professor and author and, finally, to the *Autobiography of Saint Teresa of Avila*, which she read in one sitting, then declared, “That is the Truth!” Baptized on January 1, 1922, observed then as the feast of Jesus’ initiation into the covenant of Abraham, confirmed on February 2, the feast of Jesus’ Presentation in the Temple, Edith entered the cloistered Carmelites in Cologne, transferring to a convent in Holland when she realized that, because of the Nazi persecution of the Jews, her presence could imperil the safety of the other nuns. She died in the gas chambers of Auschwitz as a daughter of Israel and of the Church.

WHY SEND OUR CHILDREN TO RELIGIOUS EDUCATION?



To answer that question, I will begin with another question, "Why does my family need faith?" As every good parent knows, parenting involves much more than providing basic food and shelter, education and health care. Parenting is also about loving and caring, building self-esteem and a sense of values. Effective parenting helps children

understand how they relate to others and what they can do to make the world a better place for themselves and for all people.

Faith provides family members with shared beliefs and values to guide their life together and to direct their involvement beyond the family circle. Faith values nurture the family's well-being and provide it with the criteria needed to weigh and evaluate the many messages that come its way each day. As parents model faith values at home and in the community, nurture a sense of dignity and uniqueness in their children, and encourage family members to share their talents with others, they join with God in the sacred task of building a world based on Gospel values. Children, in turn, take what they have learned and practiced at home, and carry it into the world, guaranteeing a new generation committed to creating a world based on Gospel values.

Faith serves, as well, as a source of comfort and strength for parents, assuring them that they are not alone in the task of parenting and providing them with a special Friend they can turn to for direction and support. With our RE Program, parents are not alone in handing on their faith. We provide a structure, other adults, a safe place for "God-talk" with peers, and expertise in religious formation. We try to give our children a sense of belonging to a family larger than their own....a faith community that helps their parents to nurture Christian values and vision in their children. You have heard the saying, "It takes a village to raise a child." When it comes to raising a child in the faith, it takes a religious education program and faith community.

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is a process by which the Catholic Church welcomes new members into its communal life. The RCIA is a living experience of the Church, and not just a series of classes which teach knowledge about the Church. Although there is instruction in the facts of the faith, instruction is but one part of a larger Experience of knowing and sharing with other members of the Church.

Who is RCIA for?

It is for non-Christian men and women; for Christians that are not Catholic;
for Catholics who are baptized, but have no religious training.

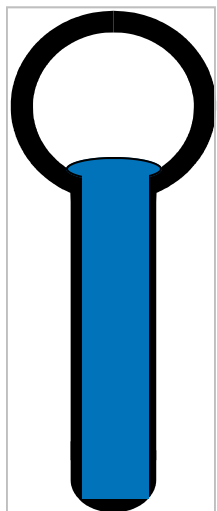

St. Alphonsus Music Ministry Ensembles

The Parish Choir...Open to all parishioners above the age of 13. This Choir serves our parish with all of the weekly and seasonal liturgical worship through music. Music sung by this choir serves to reinforce the weekly scripture. The music ranges from our liturgically sacred past to the most recent sacred contemporary.

The Children's Schola—Open to children in grades 1-8. Children 7th grade and above may also participate in a Youth Cantor Program.

The Volunteer Cantor Ministry...Providing song leadership to the assembly at all designated liturgies with music. The cantor ministry will also provide small ensemble singing at selected non-choir liturgies.

The Instrumental Ensemble...Open by audition to anyone with at least three years of experience and training on their instrument.

The Handbell Ensemble...Open to all parishioners above the age of 10.

The Classical Ensemble...Open to all adult parishioners. This ensemble offers the opportunity to sing in a parish choir to those who cannot make the more time-demanding commitment to the Parish Choir. The repertoire of this ensemble is primarily reflective of St. Alphonsus past choral music tradition.

The Resurrection Choir...Open to all parishioners who are generally available any morning for funeral services as they arise. This is a very good ministry for those who cannot make the time commitment to the other parish ensembles.

- Volunteer Cantor Ministry—Twice monthly for 90 minutes

- Classical Ensemble—Once each month prior to its monthly mass

- Resurrection Choir—All funerals unless otherwise requested by the family of the deceased.
